Harbor Humane Hero Award







In January, HHS presented 11 year old Mallory Bosma with the first Harbor Humane Hero Award in front of 60 of her peers at Cityside Middle School in Zeeland. Mallory has been a valuable volunteer, coming to the shelter regularly once or twice a week, to help clean and cuddle cats. She became concerned that two sibling cats, Tinkerbell and Peter Pan, would not be adopted together and she decided to act. Mallory offered up her Christmas money to pay for one half of the cat's adoption fees if someone would adopt both animals. She appeared on Red Kingman's WHTC radio show, to make her plea to the public. During the interview, an anonymous donor called and pledged to pay the other half of the fee. Right before Christmas, both cats went to a loving, new home!





Mallory is a wonderful example of how students can really make an impact and help HHS realize its mission.

She received a framed certificate which read "In recognition of extraordinary kindness, sacrifice and generosity in helping this organization give homeless pets a second chance at life and love. We commend your contribution to our mission and your service to this community's animals."
