And then there was an older terrier mix who came in as a stray this fall. She was very skinny and shy. She was not spayed and obviously had had several litters of puppies. She had not been well cared for. She was malnourished and had developed a yeast infection which made her smell. She had contact dermatitis from fleas and her toenails were very, very long. But we gave her multiple rounds of antibiotics, medicated baths to help ease her skin and a name – Layla. This sweet girl is now feeling much better. She's been eating, is back to a healthy weight and is waiting to be adopted into her forever home.

As we at Harbor look back over 2014, people like you helped a lot of animals like KitKat and Layla. And we want to tell you how grateful we are that you made it all possible. But there are many, many more like them who need you this holiday season.
